## Highlights of 2020

MCA: 2020 Greater Cincinnati Nonprofit of the Year Awards Finalist!

### **RESTORATION**

Magnifiying our impact by partnering with communities to restore the local watershed.

- \$590,000 in grants awarded for wetland enhancement and dam mitigation
- · 700 feet of streambank restored
- 400 live stakes installed
- 2.0 acres floodplain planted in native species
- 24 adults attended restoration workshop and tour
- · 4 interns hosted
- · 2 stream restoration projects completed
- · 1 subwatershed plan approved

### **EDUCATION**

Engaging the next generation of Mill Creek Stewards

- 88 youth and adults participated in 1 of 8 educational programs
- New online educational video series got over 500 views
- 71 volunteers donated over 575 hours as citizen scientists in our WQM program
- 16 participants received OEPA Qualified Data Collector Level II training
- 8 interns worked over 500 hours on WQM and environmental justice

### **RECREATION**

Encouraging residents to explore Cincinnati's hidden gem, the Mill Creek

- 101 participants paddled on 1 of 7 Urban Stream Adventures
- 37 bikers/walkers inaugurated MCA paddle /peddle loops on the Mill Creek Greenway Trail
- 116 volunteers donated over 1,100 hours picking up trash along the Mill Creek, and removed over 5 tons of trash and more than 300 tires in 1st ever Trash-a-Thon
- 6 iNaturalist projects documented over 7,500 observations of 1,126 species by 746 citizen scientists in the Mill Creek Watershed



MCA is encouraging Cincinnati residents to explore the Mill Creek and enjoy this urban gem by land and by water.

This year has brought unprecedented challenges to our communities, our country, and to our work. We've had to accept restrictions which have changed our everyday lives in ways we would have never imagined a year ago. The pandemic has required MCA to creatively adapt all of our projects and programs. Working remotely much of the time and becoming Zoom experts were certainly not in any of our plans a few short months ago.

One thing has not changed! With your support, Mill Creek Alliance is a Force of Nature and a Force For Nature. With your help, we have created virtual educational resources for our many school partners. With your help, we have continued to restore Mill Creek and its watershed, literally and figuratively shifting the current on the health of the stream and our watershed communities. This year saw MCA complete two stream restoration projects and successfully obtain funding for 3 additional projects.

With your help, we have continued to make the Mill Creek a better place to live, work, and play, removing, literally, tons of trash and tires from Mill Creek and its tributaries. With your help, we make the Mill Creek Watershed cleaner. Outdoor activity and trail use has boomed during the pandemic and MCA is actively extending the Mill Creek Greenway Trail and introducing ever more people to the joys of hiking, biking, paddling, and fishing along the stream.

With your help, we have continued and increased our monitoring of the health of the stream (now at 57 locations) and are tracking the remarkable return of freshwater mussels, walleye, mink, osprey, and many other indicator species to the watershed.
