Restoring the Mill Creek and Growing the Next Generation of Environmental Stewards

As the soil warmed up last spring, the Mill Creek Alliance education programs sprang into action planting the seeds for the next generation of environmental stewards. Spring and Fall school programs engaged nearly 1,000 youth from dozens of schools in both in-school and after-school activities.

Our education programs are for young and old alike. We work both in classrooms and creek side with youth at the primary and secondary level. As well as with older students and adults. We are excited to grow this curriculum and these programs in 2020.

Planting Seeds for Students:

- Students from Western Hills University High School, DePaul Cristo Rey High School, Clark Montessori High School Government classes, Walnut Hill High School AP Environmental Studies classes, and Gamble Montessori Middle School participated in multi-day programs that included classroom learning and field experience including streambank surveys, macroinvertebrate identification, and water quality chemistry experiments.
- Youth from Ethel Taylor Elementary, Wyoming Middle School, Oyler School, Cincy Hebrew Day School, and the Winton Place Youth Center engaged in programs in conservation, gardening, water quality, and more.
- Blue Team Interns at Mill Creek Alliance boast affiliation with UC, NKU, and the College of Mt. St. Joseph. These interns received training and certification from the Ohio EPA in stream habitat assessment (cQHEI) on their way to becoming Level II Qualified Data Collectors (QDC).

Tending the Soil of Youth in Summer Time:

- Summer youth outdoor activities turn teens into movers and shakers. This summer, teens built birdhouses for the Freedom Trail at Salway Park, bridges at the Cuyahoga National Park, gardens at MoBo/Village Green in Northside, and bear boxes at Yellowstone National Park. They explored The Edge of Appalachia, the Thomas Moore Biology Field Station, the Oxbow Nature Conservancy, Fernald Preserve, the Mill Creek and the Ohio & Cuyahoga Rivers. They traveled by foot, bike, boat, car, van & air.
- Over 200 students attended River Works Discovery/Who Works the River, a free maritime career education event held on the Ohio River

Watching Adults Grow & Act as Environmental Champions:

 Adult volunteers from GE Young Professionals Group, Crossroads Church, Collective Visions, UC Sustainability Program, Xavier University, Green Umbrella Watershed Action Team, and Shomrei Olam-Jewish Environmental Advocates of Cincinnati used their time and talent to take action. They supported watershed restoration by engaging in hands-on creek-side activities (i.e. water quality monitoring, invasive species removal, rain garden installation, stream and trail restoration, forestry).

Restoration projects, like the Mill Creek Sharon Creek Confluence Project, repair the flood plain, restore native species to stabilize the banks, and install new rock riffles to re-establish fish ecology. We help communities solve water problems!
